Recommended trip checklist and reminders

In order to make your trip the most enjoyable we have put together a list of items and practices that will optimize your day for both you and your party

- Bring sun block SPF 30 and higher recommended
- Bring/wear sunglasses, hat, long sleeve shirt/pants
- For the colder fishing months, please layer clothing with thermal base layers, waterproof/insulated outerwear recommended, ski type jackets and pants work well if you don't own waterproof fishing gear, waterproof insulated gloves
 Please use your best judgement on what to wear based on the anticipated weather/sea conditions
- Bring extra clothing (ex: sweatshirt, long pants), mornings and late afternoons can be
 quite chilly on the water, even during the summer. There can be a 10-15 deg
 temperature difference from land to the open waters
- We strongly urge you to wear waterproof non-skid footwear, our commercial boat tends to get wet
- Don't forget to bring any medications you take, or any special dietary food needs
- If you think you may get sea sick, don't chance it, take a motion sickness pill late the night before the trip and another 2 hours before our scheduled departure
- Please use sound judgement as to who is in your fishing party taking in mind the type and duration of your booked charter trip. A vessel environment is dynamic and ever changing due to conditions. A persons age , physical abilities or ailments may hinder a person's ability to tolerate these conditions.
- While we provide all necessary bait and tackle for the trip, your always welcome to bring that special rod and bait you may prefer
- Bring food and snacks, even if it's only a 4 hour charter, fishing seems to bring out the munchies in all of us. We supply complimentary water bottles during your trip.
- Bring a cooler to bring home your catch, you don't want to spoil your fish (we provide ice)

Please don't forget to tip the boat mate who works hard to ensure you have a great day aboard the Miss Marie . It is customary to tip the mate 20% of charter cost.
